ORDER

On this day, the Court considered the status of litigation initiated by Mr. Brandon Callier in the El Paso Division of the Western District of Texas. Dating back to 2006 or earlier, Mr. Callier has initiated approximately 100 lawsuits in this Division. And as of the date of this Order, at least sixteen of those lawsuits remain pending. Mr. Callier has initiated all of these cases manually and filed all subsequent documents therein on paper. And the Court has provided him with notice of all of its orders via certified mail. Doing so in the many cases to which Mr. Callier is a party has required a significant expenditure of limited, taxpayer-funded resources.

Ordinarily, pro se litigants may only be granted permission to register as users in the Court's CM/ECF electronic filing system on a case-by-case basis. But the Court finds that Mr. Callier's uncommonly heavy caseload warrants an exception to that policy. Mr. Callier has informed the Court that he has access to all of the technology required to file and accept service of all case documents electronically. *See* Plaintiff's Notice to the Court Regarding Plaintiff's Electronic,

Software and Computer Capabilities, *Callier v. Elite Insurance Partners, LLC*, No. 3:23-cv-253-KC (W.D. Tex. July 24, 2023), ECF No. 5.

Accordingly, it is **ORDERED** that Mr. Brandon Callier shall contact the Clerk's Office of this Division to **REGISTER** as a filing user with the Court's CM/ECF electronic filing system, **by no later than August 28, 2023**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that once registered, Mr. Callier shall **INITIATE** all new cases, **FILE** all documents with the Court, and **ACCEPT** service of all Court Orders and documents filed by other parties, electronically through the CM/ECF system.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Mr. Callier shall comply with the Administrative Policies and Procedures for Electronic Filing in Civil and Criminal Cases of the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas.¹

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk's Office shall mail a copy of this Order to Mr. Callier at his current address on file, via certified mail, return receipt requested. The Clerk's office shall retain this original Order in its records.

Mr. Callier is **CAUTIONED** that this Order may be rescinded at any time and for any reason, including in the event that he abuses his privileges through harassing, excessive, or otherwise unprofessional filings.



Mr. Callier is **FURTHER CAUTIONED** that all deadlines in the pending cases to which he is a party remain in effect. To the extent that any deadlines may elapse prior to Mr. Callier's completion of registration for electronic filing, he must file documents via mail or in person to comply with said deadlines.

Mr. Callier is **FURTHER CAUTIONED** that once registered as a user with the Court's electronic filing system, he will **NO LONGER** receive paper copies of Court orders through the mail.
