
Effective immediately and superseding all prior orders, any party or attorney filing a Motion for Continuance of a Rearraignment or Revocation of Supervised Release hearing scheduled for a Tuesday in the Waco Division of the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas shall abide by the following requirements:

1. Any Motion for Continuance of the Rearraignment or Revocation of Supervised Release hearing scheduled for a Tuesday must be filed by **12:00 p.m. the Friday before** the scheduled hearing or the day before any courthouse closures that would affect this deadline. Any Motion for Continuance sought after that deadline must be made orally and in person at the time of the scheduled hearing.
2. The Court will typically grant one (1) Motion for Continuance as a matter of course.
3. All subsequent Motions for Continuance must include a Certificate of Conference stating that all parties have conferred. The Certificate of Conference will state each party's position regarding the motion. It is unacceptable for Movant to state in the Motion that Movant has attempted to confer with the Government, but the Government was not available at the time of attempted conference.
4. Additionally, the title of the Motion must identify whether the Motion is Opposed or Unopposed and identify the number of continuances previously filed (e.g., "Defendant's Second Unopposed Motion for Continuance").

Failure to comply with this Order will result in a summary denial and termination of the Motion for Continuance. A summary denial and termination of the Motion will include a copy of this Order as a reminder to counsel.

It is so **ORDERED**.
