

NOTICE TO SHOW CAUSE WHY PROSPECTIVE JUROR, DAVID C. WILLIAMSON, SHOULD NOT BE HELD IN CONTEMPT OF COURT

Before the Court is the lack of jury service record of David C. Williamson dating back to 1995. The record reflects that Mr. Williamson has evaded his responsibility as a citizen of the United States through various excuses for the past seven years. Other judges have bent over backwards to accommodate Mr. Williamson. Enough is enough.

Although Mr. Williamson could live in a country which does not require jury service, such as Iraq, Cuba, North Korea, or Russia, Mr. Williamson wants the benefits of American citizenship but apparently without fulfilling the responsibility. Mr. Williamson's arrogant attitude is reminiscent of the Vietnam era appellation given to those who were all in favor of war so long as someone else made the military sacrifice. They were known as "chicken hawks." (During the seven years that Mr. Williamson has whined, I and at least one other local federal judge of whom I am aware, have reported to jury service three times. I will be reporting again for jury service during the first part of October, 2002.)

Mr. Williamson has finally placed the straw on the camel's back which breaks the Court's patience and leads to this order which potentially will have Mr. Williamson found in contempt and jailed accordingly. Mr. Williamson's correspondence of February 23, 2002, and July 28, 2002, (attached hereto as Exhibit A), includes a bill in which he indicates he expects to be paid his usual

rate of \$100 per hour. Attached as Exhibit B is a copy of Mr. Williamson's latest correspondence of August 4, 2002. Mr. Williamson contemptuously thinks his time is more valuable than that of his fellow citizens. Mr. Williamson has also contemptuously suggested that the Court call Mr. Williamson to schedule an appointment with Mr. Williamson to discuss the matter. Mr. Williamson does not indicate whether the Court will have to pay the \$100 per hour rate.

The Court is happy to accommodate Mr. Williamson's suggestion for an appointment: Mr. Williamson is HEREBY ORDERED TO APPEAR in Courtroom 2 of the John H. Wood, Jr. United States Courthouse, 655 East Durango Boulevard, San Antonio, Texas 78206, at 8:30 a.m. on August 26, 2002, to show cause why he should not be held in CONTEMPT OF THIS COURT AND JAILED ACCORDINGLY, save and except that Mr. Williamson can purge himself of his contemptuous acts by reporting for jury service at the same time, at the same place, and on the same date and to be paid the usual rate as other American citizens at \$40 a day, plus mileage.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the United States Marshals Service is AUTHORIZED and DIRECTED to service this Order as soon as practicable on David C. Williamson at the following address:

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court send a copy of this letter by certified mail, return receipt requested to Mr. Williamson at the above listed address. The Court will send a courtesy copy to Mr. Williamson by facsimile transmission.

First of all thank you so much for your prompt response to my request. Also thank you so very much for your understanding in granting my request to be excused from the JURY Panel: P-40-5 Juror no: 44, although your response sites "Service on the P-39-5 Panel".

Dear Mr. Putnicki and/or Pamela j. Ramsey and/or Honorable Court,

On February 11, February 23, and March 30 of this year, 2002, I have sent correspondence to you and your office concerning jury duty requirements and payment you owe me as a result of those requirements. To date you have not acknowledged either the correspondence or the request for payment.

The directive I received from Pamela J. Ramsey, dated February 19,2002 indicates the entire month of August 2002 is to be made available for you and your required jury duty. To date there have been no summons and per your rules they will be sent 30 days in advance.
