POSITION OVERVIEW: The United States District Court for the Western District of Texas is recruiting for a term law clerk to U.S. Magistrate Judge Henry Bemporad. The term law clerk assists the magistrate judge with the civil docket by preparing and assisting the judge in connection with hearings and trials, researching legal issues, and drafting initial drafts of orders and reports and recommendations. The term law clerk also supports the magistrate judge with the criminal docket by managing warrants and other requests from the U.S. Attorney's Office and researching criminal law and procedure issues as they arise. Beginning and end dates are somewhat flexible; however, employment is anticipated to begin after October 1, 2022, and end before September 30, 2023. Therefore, the position will not cover a full year.

QUALIFICATIONS: To qualify for the position of Term Law Clerk, an applicant must graduate from an accredited law school, have excellent academic credentials, possess superior legal research and writing skills, and be proficient in computer-assisted research. The applicant must be a team player and willing to perform administrative tasks as needed. The applicant will be expected to draft orders and other documents efficiently, thoroughly, and promptly. Preference will be given to those applicants with (a) civil litigation experience, (b) familiarity with federal law and procedure, and (c) journal or other legal-writing experience.

BENEFITS: This position is entitled to health insurance, scheduled holidays, and periodic salary increases. The Court is not authorized to reimburse candidates for travel or moving expenses. This position is subject to mandatory Electronic Funds Transfer participation for payment of net pay.

The final candidate will be subject to criminal history and financial background investigations by law enforcement agencies, which include FBI fingerprinting. In addition, the applicant must be a United States citizen or a lawful permanent resident (*i.e.*, green card holder) who shows proof of seeking citizenship.
